After numerous attempts to decipher the script of the Indus Valley (or Harappan) civilization (2600 – 1900 B.C.), there is no consensus if some of these attempts have been successful. The difficulty stems from the absence of a bilingual inscription, where the text in the unknown Indus Valley script (IVS) appears with its counterpart in a text of known characters.

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Earlier Attempts for Decipherment of Indus Script: In 1931 J. Marshall published his magnum work where Gadd and Langdom had important contributions on decipherment. According to them, the language group was Indo-Aryan and they might have been the ancestors of Brahmi. From 1950 researchers started to read them in the Dravidian way.
